JUNIOR TYNWALD

The Isle of Man Branch annually holds a Junior Tynwald to which pupils of all the Island's Senior Schools are invited through the Department of Education. The normal format for the programme is:

| 12.00-13.00 | A buffet lunch in the Barrool Suite. |

At the Junior sitting at which the President of Tynwald usually presides, students submit questions which are answered by the relevant Minister or Member, and two motions are debated and voted upon.

SCHOOLS VISITS

Pupils from the Junior Schools are encouraged to undertake a tour of the Chambers and to be present in the Public Gallery for part of a sitting. The travel expenses for such tours are paid for by the Branch.

COMMONWEALTH DAY

On Commonwealth Day (the second Monday in March) young people from throughout the Commonwealth are invited to visit London to participate in the celebrations and attend a special service in Westminster Abbey. The Isle of Man Branch nominates two students from the Island who are studying in the UK at the time to attend the celebrations and, if the nominations are successful, pays their travelling expenses to enable them to attend.
